There are two WCs and Urinals at the Front of the Church, and two WCs in the St Andrew's Centre

Churchyard: you will see that certain areas have been cordoned off, and we would be grateful if you could respect this and the monuments to past generations.

Hopfest from Red Squirrel Brewing ABV: 3.8%

New world hop based pale ale with a bouquet of tropical fruit salad and underlined hints of lime. The flavour starts with a pronounced pineapple fruitiness and is followed by a lemon sherbert-esque testiness.



The Mad Squirrel's European IPA ABV: 5.2%

Deep amber in colour this IPA is exclusively made with European hops which create a diverse aroma of maple syrup, marmalade and grapes. The flavour profile is a marriage of hedgerow fruits and marmalade.



Mister Squirrel, An Award Winning Best-Seller ABV: 4.0%

A traditional Premium English Bitter with pleasantly presented copper hue with a flavour spectrum of plum, toffee and mixed dried fruit.



Red Squirrel Raspberry Pale Ale ABV: 4.5%

This refreshing summer beer is late hopped for low bitterness, and unfined to maximise flavour and retain its deep reddish hue. Red Squirrel: We at St Andrew's are very grateful to Red Squirrel for all their help and advice. Their beers win prizes, and in May 2016 the brewery released two new beers, one of which (the European IPA in the Mad Squirrel range, made with five different hops) is featured in our Festival.
