“Love is the Only Thing Stronger than Hate”

I have to confess that until the recent Grammys, I'd never heard of the world's most played music artist. At the ceremony, Bad Bunny made history as the first Spanish-language-singer to win three awards. His fame spread even further when recently he performed a joyous Puerto Rican set at the interval of this year's prestigious Super Bowl, alongside Lady Gaga and Ricky Martin.

After his anti-ICE comments at his Grammy acceptance speech, it's unsurprising that President Trump was not a fan, deeming the Super Bowl show; 'Absolutely terrible, one of the worst EVER! No one understands a word this guy is saying.'

The Puerto Rican Bad Bunny, real name Benito Occasio, used his Super Bowl performance as a love letter to the Americas. He ended the show holding a football with the message 'Together we are America', as a giant bill board displayed the slogan 'Love is the only thing stronger than hate.'

For a Latin artist to perform on the world's biggest sporting stage was momentous for the many Latino people across the U.S. and the Americas. In the words of one, 'It was a decolonizing moment, a healing moment.'

Jesus, another non-English speaker, was a similar beacon of hope for those marginalized by the elite and powerful. As we enter this time of Lent in preparation for Easter, we are reminded that the message of Resurrection is the same as that half-time billboard; 'Love is the only thing stronger than hate.' On the cross, Jesus took the full force of the world's hate and transformed it through a forgiving Love. May that same Love remind us that Together We Are Humanity. And may it create within us, and through us, many healing moments this Lent, this Easter and beyond.



..... Bells in the Belfry



Church bells play such a massive part in the life and communication of a church. At St Mary's we are so blessed to have had our own team of bell ringers for the past few years. For services, weddings, national celebrations and other occasions. Four of our 6 bells in the Bell Belfry go back to the 1550's with a further one added a 100 years later and the sixth in the works of 1891. The bells are hung for full circle ringing in an oak frame and were rehung in 1958.

The photo on the left shows several of the team in the Ringing Chamber below the Bell Belfry. This chamber is accessed by a very narrow spiral staircase in the SW corner by the west doors. The members of the team here from L-R are Laura, Phil, David, Jon, Elizabeth, Maxine & Howard. In addition to the full bell ringing occasions one of the team also does a one bell tolling at 9am on a Sunday morning prior to the 9.15am service.

..... Tick Tock the Church Clock




Hertingfordbury Millwright, Thomas Newman (1782 -1870), who is buried in St Mary's churchyard, spent two years in his capacity as Church Warden researching and planning a clock for St. Mary (**left**), as well as organising its financing and installation. On 6th May 1854 a deposit of £30 was paid to Hertford clock maker James Skerman. The village raised the further £73-19

“Jesus is the Answer – What is the Question”

We are continuing to highlight some of the very meaningful messages from our church sermons, by not only Revs Alan & Bill but also our inspiring team of Lay Readers of Worship. This month we have a sermon from Lay reader Geoff Oates

I'm not a big film fan, but I can't help noticing that our film and TV industries seem ever keener on reinterpreting beloved classics of past years for a new generation. 2025 saw Disney's live action Snow White, you can always count on the BBC for their annual Agatha Christie remake, 2026 already threatens us with a new Wuthering Heights, HBO is reworking all the Harry Potter stories, and Netflix promise us two Jane Austen standards. I wonder how faithful they will be to the originals?

Are you the kind of person who looks forward to discovering what new and creative angles can be given to familiar scenes and characters? Or are you, like me, the kind who will sit there in growing annoyance, pointing out all the good bits they've left out or spoiled, or the bits they've added that only pander to passing fads and trends....until my wife tells me to go sit in the kitchen and leave her to enjoy the film on its own.

So maybe I'm not the right person to introduce one of history's earliest and best known remakes – the Gospel of St John. One, maybe two generations after St Mark's classic “Gospel”, a man named John reworks the tale for a new and very different audience.

Right at the start John makes his mark with a very different take on two familiar scenes from the original – the Baptism of Jesus, and the calling of the first disciples. There's a good start, we still get the Holy Spirit coming down on Jesus, but watch carefully - maybe you'll have to rewind that bit and look again – John the Baptist doesn't actually baptise Jesus at all. Maybe St John was so fed up with all the years of argument in the early Church about why the sinless Jesus had to be baptised, that he just thought it was easiest just to cut the scene out.

There is one big bit that isn't in the original version. But it's hard to grumble about this one because it really sounds like it was. ‘Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.’ One of the best loved, and most profound and most familiar of epithets for Jesus. Yet this is the first and only time we hear these words in the whole Bible. It sounds like John the Baptist is quoting the Old Testament prophets – but he isn't. This is new, and yet like so many good new things, it has ancient roots.

It has echoes of the Passover lamb, slain on the night God delivered Israel from slavery in Egypt, it has echoes of the scapegoat, the ancient annual Hebrew ritual of driving an animal off into desert with the sins of the people figuratively borne on its back.

And the name lives on in our hymns and our liturgy in the *Angus Dei*: ‘Jesus, Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world, have mercy on us.’ A new thing that has become part of the heritage.

But you're more likely to notice what's missing from the next scene, the first disciples. No Lake Galilee, no fishing boats, no pairs of brothers, no iconic call to become ‘fishers of men’ (he'd have to make that a bit more inclusive today anyway). Surely St John's version lost something here?

Instead, John the Baptist turns to two of his followers and says, ‘he's the one, go follow him’, and they do. Maybe John recognises that for a new generation of believers around the

Eastern Mediterranean, this new narrative might be more helpful? His readers are no longer people who met Jesus in the flesh, and they live far removed from the provincial backwaters of Galilee. They have found faith because someone else has pointed the way to Jesus and shared His Good News. Maybe St John’s “remake” gets closer to our experience too?

One of those two disciples is Andrew. ‘The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon’. The first instinct of the new follower is to pass on the good news to those nearest to us. Does the remake offer another challenge we need to hear?

The first words Jesus speaks in Mark’s Gospel are commands. ‘Repent. Believe. Follow me’.

The first words Jesus speaks in John’s Gospel are... a question. ‘What are you looking for?’

There’s an old tale of an exchange of graffiti found on a bus shelter wall. ‘Jesus is the answer’ proclaimed an unnamed Christian scribbler. Beneath was written, in a different hand, ‘But what’s the question?’ And the dialog ended with the response ‘It doesn’t matter’.



That’s kind of true – for those who have already put their faith in Jesus. But it can sound awfully smug to everyone else. Unless we are prepared to help them to find the question that they need to ask.

Down the centuries the Church has been very good at telling people what the answers are, often without waiting for them to ask a question. Or telling them that they are asking the wrong questions. Would we get a lot more engagement with the wider world if we opened our dialog with those first words of Jesus, ‘What are you looking for?’

And we don’t need to worry that we might not always have an answer, and certainly not one of the the off-pat, neatly pre-packaged answers that our creeds and catechisms might sometimes encourage.

We might achieve more by sharing openly our own questions, even our doubts and fears, and then setting off together to wherever we need to go to find an answer, rambling on together towards trust and truth.

That would need a big “remake” of the story for a lot of people in the Church. But it’s faithful to the call of Jesus, and it’s faithful to the example of John – to try tell the Gospel again in words that speak to a new generation, that helps them find what they looking for, and maybe also to find what we are looking for.



Friends of Panshanger Park


Panshanger Park is a wonderful natural area within our wider community and so the Friends of Panshanger Park are sharing some of it's history - some of which will include the village and greens and some not.

This month Kate Harwood looks at the Panshanger Ice-House and how these were used more widely in the 18th century

The Panshanger Ice-House

The problem of saving ice, available in winter from frozen ponds and lakes, for summer when it could be used for preserving food, medical uses and luxuries such as ice cream, led to the development of the ice-house in the 17th century. However, these did not become popular until the 18th century, especially after the development of grand landscape gardens with extensive canals or lakes. Although distinction has been made between ice well (an underground facility) and ice- house (an ornamental parkland building above ground) most people refer to all of them as ice-houses.

The construction of an ice-house was also expensive so, although there were some commercial ones, many were in the grounds of grand country houses. The commercial ones were found in places like London where high demand and low supply led to the import, from the 1840s of huge blocks of ice from the United States. Wenham Lake Ice Co (Mass.) was the leading supplier and gained a Royal Warrant from Queen Victoria. By 1880 10 million tons of ice were being imported from America. Since 1857, ice had been imported from the southern Norwegian mountain lakes. This was cleaner and soon became more popular than that from America. On arrival at the docks the ice was transferred to commercial ice-houses such as the giant one built in the 1780s in Regents Park or the two on the Regent's Canal built for Carlo Gatti, the ice-cream manufacturer. His wells were 42 feet deep and 30 feet diameter. It was also sent to private residences in portable ice boxes, invented in 1803. With the development of the refrigerator from 1913 (although customers had to wait will 1927 for a safe version) and the making of ice in factories, the import trade ceased about 1921.



An ice-house is essentially a giant brick-lined hole, most of them shaped like an inverted cone, and with a domed roof, so the whole thing resembles a filled ice-cream cornet. The domestic ice-house was of similar design to the commercial ones but of more modest dimensions. One at Balls Park in Hertford was measured and found to be 10 foot diameter at the level of the entrance passage. 14 foot high from apex of dome to bottom, of which 8 foot

was below the level of the passage. Ice-houses were dug in a hill where the access door could face north, to keep it cool, with earth piled on top for insulation.

Trees were often planted on top to provide extra shade and beech was a popular species. Behind the door was a short brick-lined passage leading to the hole, often with another door to help with the insulation. At the bottom of the cone a channel ran downhill to carry away the meltwater.

In Hertfordshire alone, 36 Ice-Houses have been identified, and others, probably mis-labelled 'Game Larder' etc, by Ordnance Survey are possible. Roxford in Hertingfordbury, Balls Park and Hertford Castle were also furnished with them and Hertford Castle's mound is still there in the garden by Castle Street.

In country estates ice was harvested from nearby frozen lakes or ponds and stacked in the ice-house. Insulation was provided by the brick wall and by packing the ice with straw. This proved effective enough to keep the ice until summer.

It is likely that Panshanger's ice-house was not constructed until Humphry Repton's Lake had been dug in 1799 and there was thus sufficient ice to make it worthwhile. Capability Brown often provided ice-houses on estates where he laid out a lake but at Cole Green, up on the plateau, there was no lake, only a couple of modest ponds. The first map to show the ice-house is the 1862 Panshanger Estate Map which shows it nestling at the north-western end of the Chisel Shelf with the door facing north west over the approach drive across the park. Just to the side of it is Cowper's Seat, which we have mentioned previously

For many years this was locked with access limited as it was considered a bat roost. However, last year the entrance was cleared and repaired by Maydencroft and the steps leading up to Cowper's Seat rediscovered. As can be seen from the photographs supplied by Maydencroft this was a well-built entrance with splayed approach and an engineering brick pavement which continues inside the passage to the brick pit.

More research is still required to discover the dimensions of the ice-house and its date of construction.

WALTER WALLINGER CHARITY

Walter Wallinger died in 1709 leaving "Four hundred pounds for the placing of poor children of this Parish as Apprentices."

Times have moved on and the trustees of the charity now take the view that the income from the endowment should be used to give grants for educational purposes to people under 25 who have for at least two years lived, or been educated, within 'the ancient parish of Hertingfordbury' which today roughly means Hertingfordbury village and the five Greens and outlying houses.

Something of the order of £1500 is available annually. Typically grants are one-off payments not exceeding £450 for something that will help with the applicant's education in a broad sense, such as a musical instrument, specialist equipment, a field or other course. Grants are available to anyone in school, FE or Higher Education.
