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The Four Corners of Joy

I read a great book recently by the Canadian author Kate Bowler called 'Joyful Anyway'. In recent years, Kate has survived a stage 4 cancer diagnosis, and although she feels like she should be grateful, she still feels what she calls the 'ache'... an ache for meaning, for connection; ultimately and ache for joy.

And so, she goes on a quest to discover more joy!

At a dinner party, Kate ended up sitting beside a behavioural psychologist, to whom she confessed; 'I'm trying to figure out how to be more joyful'. His response was interesting. 'Approach Joy', he said 'as you would a jigsaw puzzle. Where do you start?'. 'With the edges or the corners' she replied.

'Exactly', he said, 'Work out what the four corners of Joy are for you?'. In other words, what are the (at least) four things that you already know bring you the most Joy? Make each one your focus. Invest in and nurture these four areas of life, and Joy will come! So, what are the corners, or cornerstones, of your Joy?

Joy of course isn't the absence of sadness. It's big enough to hold almost everything, except perhaps despair.

In her book, Kate quotes the novelist Kaveh Akbar, who writes; 'I hope that when there is laughter, it's laughter made wise by having known real grief. And when there is grief, it is made wise by having known real joy'.

I used to think Joy was those unexpected rare little moments that surprise us with delight. But what if Joy is already there waiting for us to invest in and nurture?

Miss Dolly Parton

We are continuing to highlight some of the very meaningful messages from our church sermons, by not only Revs Alan & Bill but also our inspiring team of Lay Readers of Worship. This month we have a recent sermon given by Rev Alan at the Wednesday Morning Eucharist held at St Mary's on 26th August, the day after the passing of the Country Music star Dolly Parton. Here Alan reflects beautifully on the person, the Christian, the philanthropist that Dolly was and may she Rest in Peace



Yesterday, the world lost, not only one of its best song-writers, businesswomen and philanthropists, but also one of the greatest examples of how to be a Christian... Miss Dolly Parton.

Everyone loved her; her candour, her humour ('It costs a lot of money to look this cheap!'), her grit, her grace; her deep faith that carried her throughout her life from dirt-poor beginnings in Tennessee to global mega-stardom.

She reminded us what wealth and influence can do in the hands of someone whose life is lived for others; someone who remembered what it is to have nothing, someone who values human beings over being a billionaire.

Instead, she spent her life giving her wealth away. Famously, her father couldn't read or write, so Dolly started the non-profit Dollywood Foundation to fight illiteracy. She created Dolly Parton's Imagination Library which has donated over 300 million books to children all over the world. She raised money for HIV charities when other Christians were calling the AIDS pandemic God's Judgement. She helped fund cancer centres and hospitals, and donated millions of dollars during Covid to develop vaccines. The list goes on.

Living in a country music world often populated by racism and homophobia, Dolly risked popularity and financial gain by advocating for Black Lives Matter and for the LGBTQ community.

'I think everybody should be allowed to be who they are and to love who they love' she famously said in an interview. 'A good Christian should not judge. I mean that's God's business, not yours. I believe we're all God's children and everybody has to deal with God in their own way. We're supposed to love one another'

That love emanated from Dolly's words and actions.

For 80 years she showed us that the measure of a life is in what we do with what we are given, how we treat people around us, and the person we are in both lack and abundance.

In his tribute this morning, the American pastor John Pavlovitz wrote 'Her single greatest performance was as a human being, which makes her among the richest people who have ever graced this planet.'

Today we mourn the loss of a First Lady of Country, who touched and changed the lives of so many, especially those who have lived with poverty and discrimination. But we rejoice in the magnitude of the legacy of this humble diminutive woman.

We are all creating a legacy of some kind. What legacy will you, will I, leave? Will we, like Dolly, leave this world a better place than we found it?

The St Mary's Team came together in The Brace Room on 12th September. The Welcomers set out a magnificent table of refreshments to sustain the visiting cyclists and walkers and the reception was manned by a group of parishioners for the whole day.

Visitors were slightly down in numbers compared with last year but their enjoyment was undiminished and was enhanced by the wedding of William and Rachel which was also celebrated at St Mary's on that day. The Church was filled to overflowing by wedding guests, the Groom and his groomsmen wore stylish traditional outfits and the Bride was "a picture".

St Mary's was represented in the Bike 'n Hike by five members of the congregation (plus two terriers) together with a number of friends who joined Alastair and Juliet visiting Churches in North Hertfordshire. Bill Church went to the Hertford Churches by bike whilst Christopher also visited the 10 Hertford Churches on foot. Beverley and the 2 terriers were in Little Berkhamsted and Ponsbourne. Happily it remained dry and the temperature was great for this activity. The Team set up a JustGiving page which has raised to date £1,150.00 in donations and pledges from 45 supporters - it is not too late if you would like to donate now! There was a heartening level of support from villagers and parishioners locally, demonstrating the affection in which St Mary's is held. The money raised is shared equally between BHHCT and St Mary's with any Gift Aid going to the Trust which has charitable status. The Trust makes grants to individual Churches towards the expense of maintenance, repair and improvements, which is hugely appreciated by the recipients.

Time passes and the age profile of those who participate is growing older. An attempt was made this year to hold an event in the Churchyard on 13th September for Children but this was thwarted by the weather. We shall try again so that younger members of the congregation and Friends can be more actively involved. It is very rewarding to see some of the many (more than 600) Churches in the Trust's area and to find their points of special interest, which are many and varied.

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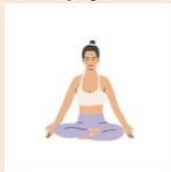
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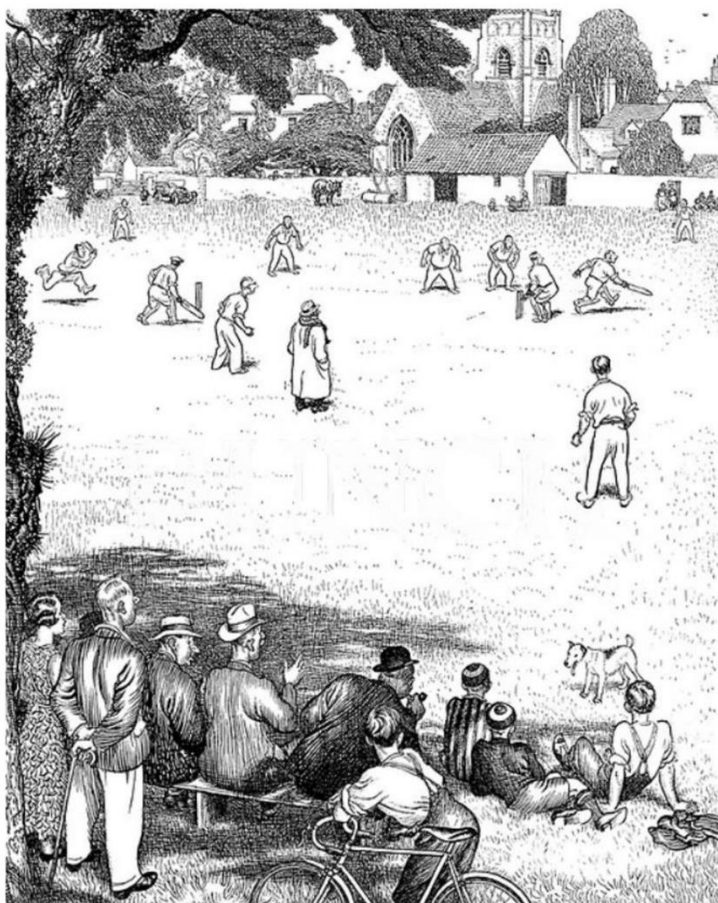
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PHEW WHAT A SCORCHER!

The 1943 image below from Punch Magazine shows an idyllic village cricket scene – not too dissimilar from our own lovely recreation ground, even down to the church! The eagle-eyed amongst you may wonder why the batsman is scuttling off the field just as the bowler is running in. The original caption reveals that he is also the local grocer who's just heard the doorbell to his nearby shop go, so has had to leave the field of play to serve a customer.

Our success could be largely measured by the following facts:

- a) We managed to get 11 players out on the field most weeks, and
- b) we weren't relegated.

This is the reality for small village cricket clubs these days. Being local to much bigger clubs with more resources, our personnel is made up either of old stalwarts with a long history at the club or returning players who fancied digging out the cricket whites after an extended absence.

To that end our youth policy is represented by a 29 year-old, whilst most of us are player's son can bring the average age down, which makes cricket one of those unique sports where three generations can play on the same field, on an equal basis.

Although winning a game is a nice bonus, we'd much rather lose to a team with a good attitude, who play in the right spirit, and stay for a beer or at least a chat afterwards. Unfortunately, there are a few league teams lacking these qualities. The Hertingfordbury way has always been to enjoy the game above all else, then sit reminiscing and exaggerating the day's heroics afterwards.



Sunday friendly cricket is a much better forum for this, and we have several such fixtures that restore our faith in the beautiful game. They also usually involve a great tea, which is now unfortunately a post-covid rarity on Saturdays.

The other battle this year was the weather. By July the outfield resembled the Gobi Desert and keeping the grass on the square alive and thus the tracks safe, involved nightly watering stints. Mindful of the eventual hosepipe ban and keen to be good citizens, we only watered the remaining wickets that would be needed to see us to the end of the season, rather than keep the whole square green for purely cosmetic purposes.

With only one league side, we leased the field out again to Hoddesdon 3rd XI on every other week, plus hosted schools cricket for Richard Hale & Hertford Prep. This not only boosts the coffers for both Hertingfordbury CC and the recreation ground, but it provides a nice playing environment for younger players and brings life to the field, often during the week when it would otherwise be empty. In all, 45 adult and junior matches were played this year.

So now we move onto renovations. By the time you read this the worn-out square will have been scarified, reseeded and top-dressed, whilst the outfield which has suffered for a long time with poor grass coverage will also get a much-needed aeration, scarifying and seeding.

The groundsman will then put his feet up for a few short months of relaxation (popping over for the occasional mow) before we start work all over again in early spring.

Friends of Panshanger Park

Panshanger Park is a wonderful natural area within our wider community and so the Friends of Panshanger Park are sharing some of it's history - some of which will include the village and greens and some not.

This month Geoff Cordingley continues with some of the interviews given by members of Hertford Oral Society

Panshanger Reflections from Hertford Oral History Group

Hertford Oral History Group (HOHG) began recording people's reminiscences in 1990. The initial aim was to collect as many of the older generation's memories as possible. Peter Ruffles, Jean Riddell and the late Eve Sangster and Mary Ollis were the main interviewers. Whilst still making recordings, the more recent emphasis has been on producing and displaying on the Hertford Museum website the associated transcripts. Over 400 recordings have been made and three quarters of the transcripts are available on Hertford Museum website.

A number of the recordings contain references to Panshanger and our community. Since the HOHG recordings are from 1990 onwards the references are to the time the estate was owned by Ettie Desborough. The seventh Earl died without issue and left the estate to Ettie, nee Fane, who was his niece. She was married to William Grenfell, Lord Desborough who owned Taplow Court, near Maidenhead. There are many short references to Panshanger in the recordings with youngsters roaming around the grounds, picnicking and bluebelling. The extracts to come give a snap shot of life in a large house in the 1920s and 1930.

Continuing extracts from Hertford Oral History Group's recordings with Mollie Warner who worked at Panshanger in the mid to late 1920s. Mollie describes how she got her job in the still room, pay, board wages and St. Thomas's Day.

"Well, it was Taplow Court, of course, yes, that's when we first started because we only came to Panshanger twice a year. Oh yes, Taplow Court. I was a Girl Guide at Taplow and her Ladyship was President of the Guides and that's how we were able to get our jobs; if she liked you, took to you, then she'd say there was a position going. And she said to me that there would be a position going in the still-room eventually, so to get it I went into the laundry. It was only a matter of about six weeks. And that's how I first started at Taplow Court."

Mollie was 15 having been born in 1910:*"I remember coming to Panshanger for the first time and the strike was on, the General Strike; that's why I remember it very plainly."*

Mollie worked in the laundry *"for about six weeks. To be able to get into the still-room. The still-room, of course, was a very, very lovely job. You only did the fancy fruits and iced tea and iced coffee and cakes and scones, you know, and rolls or anything like that.*

I don't think I was paid much, all the time I was there. I was there about seven years and the rise didn't go up, I don't think, only about once. I had £24 a year. That's what we were paid and then when Lord and Lady Desborough went away we were on what they called 'board

wages', which we were allowed 14/- a week. We had to buy all our own food with that, you see. And laundry we were allowed 2/6d. a week and we used to have to have a clean cap and apron every other day. So the money didn't go very far. But, of course, it was vastly different to what it is today."

"But I was very, very happy there. Very happy. I mean, it wasn't hard work, not when they were just on their own. We were off-duty every other day, afternoon and evening. You were expected to go to church, obviously. Well, more so at Panshanger than we were at Taplow Court and, of course, you know, when they had entertaining and parties then, of course, we did have to work very hard. Because what they called their parties would start on a Friday afternoon, ready for Friday evening dinner, you see, and would go on right until after breakfast on Monday. So, of course, we were very, very busy, working very hard. I mean, because being in the still-room, it wasn't so hard - our biggest meal for the still-room workers - well, there was only I and the head still-room maid - that we used to have to supply all the tea, you see. Used to expect, say, fourteen to fifteen different cakes to make. So we used to have to make all those. But that was our hardest meal. Used to have to supply the toast, and all that for breakfast. And in the evening our worst time was when we used to have to wait for the coffee cups and the dessert plates and if you'd been up since about half-past-five in the morning and this was getting about 11 o'clock you were very, very tired indeed, waiting for them to come out. Cos they were talking; they didn't think of the poor little girls through the back waiting to go to bed. But, yes, it was very nice but Panshanger, of course, was a gorgeous place; liked it very much"....

"Well, they had times, you see. They came down [to Panshanger] twice a year. Normally, it would be at Easter time, nearly always Easter time, and then towards Christmas. We never had a Christmas here; only one year, I think, when we were snowed up. It was dreadful. It was level with - Now, you know Fordwich Hill, don't you? - well, it was level. So you can tell how bad it was. We were completely cut off. But normally we were at Taplow Court for Christmas but she was always here for what she called her 'St. Thomas's Day'. Now all these people - estate workers, I suppose, they used to have to come to the Servants' Hall and they were allowed as much bread and cheese and hot, well, warm, beer as they wanted and then they were given so much money. She always had to be down here for that. It was normally in the November time. There was no electricity or gas in Panshanger. There was electricity for the lights but not to cook with. Everything was done by the stoves. And I think, if I remember rightly, there was one, two, three, four, five stoves in the kitchen. So you can tell how big it was. 'Cos we had a very big stove in the still-room. But everything had to be cooked on the stove."

Editors note:- Despite the land sales at the time, Panshanger House itself remained an incredibly active and elite social hub during the 1920's as Mollie recounted. Lady Desborough was a renowned society hostess and leading member of the intellectual aristocratic social group known as "The Souls". Throughout the decade, she filled the house with prominent political figures, writers and thinkers of the era, hosting regular weekend parties for guests that included Neville Chamberlain, H.G. Wells and the author and poet Vita Sackville-West

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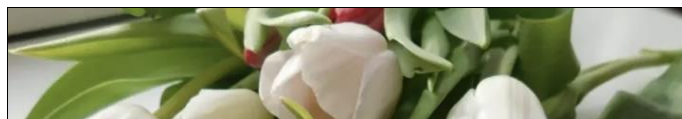
Hello Hertingfordbury and The Greens!

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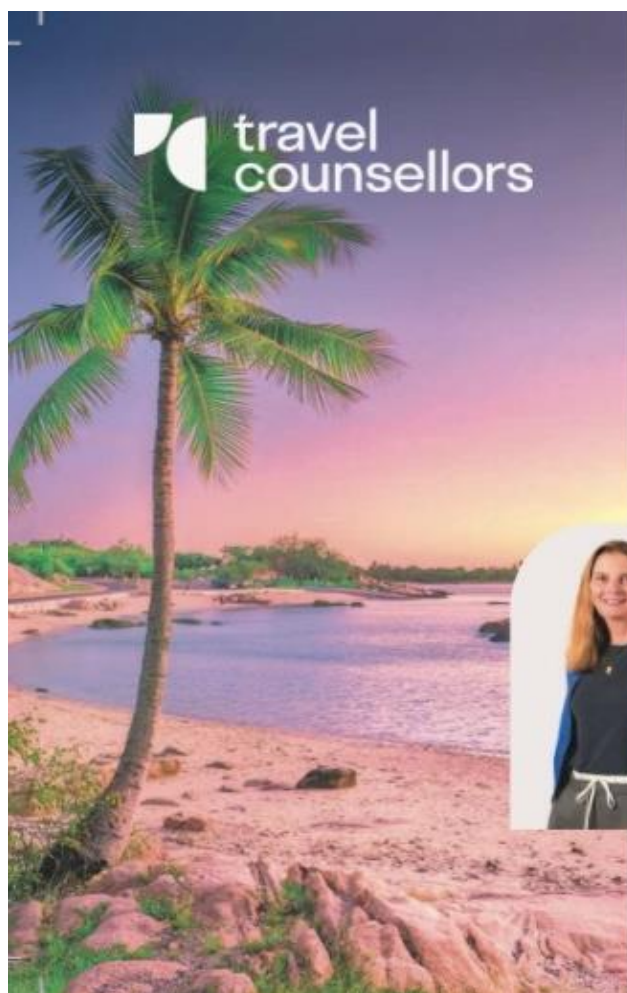

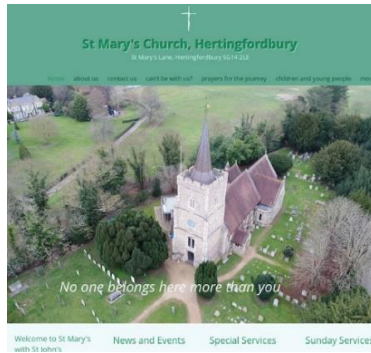


Volunteers needed to open/close St. Mary's

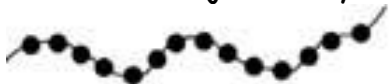
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WALTER WALLINGER CHARITY

Walter Wallinger died in 1709 leaving "Four hundred pounds for the placing of poor children of this Parish as Apprentices."

Times have moved on and the trustees of the charity now take the view that the income from the endowment should be used to give grants for educational purposes to people under 25 who have for at least two years lived, or been educated, within the ancient parish of Hertingfordbury which today roughly means Hertingfordbury village and the five Greens and outlying houses.

Something of the order of £1500 is available annually. Typically grants are one-off payments not exceeding £450 for something that will help with the applicant's education in a broad sense, such as a musical instrument, specialist equipment, a field or other course. Grants are available to anyone in school, FE or Higher Education.

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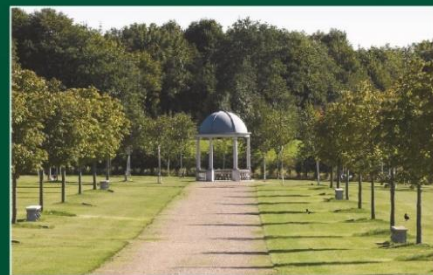
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
